PHC Awards Over \$1.7 Million For Housing at Redding Center Of Hope

FAIRFIELD – Partnership HealthPlan of California (PHC) has awarded more than \$1.7 million in grant funds for the Center of Hope in Redding, a campus that will provide housing and high-intensity primary care to people with complex health and social needs.

The funding granted to the Hill Country Community Clinic is one of 25 awards, totaling \$25 million, made by PHC for housing-related projects across the Medi-Cal managed care plan's 14-county service area. Through this grant program, PHC seeks to address the critical housing and housing-related needs that affect the health of its more than 560,000 members.

“Without a roof over your head and a safe place to sleep, it’s difficult to stay healthy,” says Liz Gibboney, CEO of PHC. “We decided to address this critical health-related issue right where it starts – by funding projects that address homelessness and the lack of housing for the most vulnerable populations in our communities.”

Hill Country will use the more than \$1.7 million to build 16 studio apartments for transitional age homeless youth at the Center of Hope and to help fund the construction of a wellness recovery center at the facility. Most Center of Hope will be enrolled in or eligible for Medi-Cal.

“Partnership HealthPlan’s funding for the Center of Hope will allow us to serve many more local residents who need intensive help to rebuild their lives, health and dignity,” says Lynn Dorroh, CEO of Hill Country Health and Wellness Center.. “We are very grateful for PHCs support of our work and expect that over time the impact will be felt by the entire community.”

In addition to the \$1.7 million, PHC also granted nearly \$270,000 for Hill Country to support a Homeless Youth Coalition, a project that lays the groundwork for a long-term commitment to ending youth homelessness in Shasta County.
