Jan 1, 2022	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• MCPs may begin offering ILOS. Additional ILOS may be added in 6 month intervals.</li></ul>
July 1, 2022	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• MCPs begin implementation of ECM. <b>MCPs must define a implementation schedule in their ECM and ILOS MOC template by ECM target population.</b> Alignment of implementation among MCPs within each County is strongly encouraged.</li></ul>
Jan 1, 2023	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• MCPs expand ECM to all target populations, including <i>Individuals Transitioning from Incarceration</i> target population.</li></ul>
