

Getting Your Breast Pump

A breast pump is a device that helps get milk from your breast. Breast pumps are no cost to eligible Partnership members.

Why use a breast pump?


Using a breast pump can maintain or increase your milk supply, relieve blocked ducts, and stop milk from building up.

When can I get a breast pump?

As a Partnership member, you can get one pump:

- A month before your due date
- Up to a year after your baby's birth
- Every 3 years as a covered benefit

How can I get a breast pump?



Your doctor can help you get a breast pump. After it is ordered, the breast pump will be mailed to you. If you have questions, please talk to your doctor.
